Connor Boyle – academy graduate and rising star in the capital back-row – has this week penned a new two-year deal with his boyhood club.

Boyle, 22, grew up a stone's throw from BT Murrayfield and represented Edinburgh district at every age-grade before making his professional debut in October 2020, becoming Edinburgh Rugby player #1280.

The former Stewart's Melville and Scotland U20 captain has since featured 28 times for the capital side and recently crossed the whitewash in December's 1872 Cup first-leg derby at Scotstoun Stadium.

The back-row was again on form in this month's BKT United Rugby Championship win against Zebre Parma, where he won more turnovers than any other player (four) in Round 12, with three of those coming from jackal steals. Boyle is part of a unit of up-and-coming back-row players in the Edinburgh pack, impressing alongside fellow academy graduate Ben Muncaster.

On penning a new deal, Boyle said: "I'm delighted to re-sign with my boyhood club. Edinburgh Rugby is the place where I see myself being able to take my game to the next level.

"The players and coaches are all hell bent on building a Championship winning culture and that is an environment I want to be part of. "The strength of the back-row, and specifically the openside position, gives me the ability to learn from the best on a day-to day-basis. This new deal will allow me to take myself to the next level of playing while continuing to live in my hometown."

A former pupil at the city's Stewart's Melville College, the abrasive back-row has impressed at every age-grade, representing Scotland at U16, U18 and U20 levels. Having played senior rugby with Stewart's Melville RFC as a schoolboy, Boyle made the move to Watsonians while studying for a degree in International Business Management at Heriot Watt University.

He was named as Scotland U20 captain for 2019 U20 Six Nations before being named in the Watsonians Rugby squad for the inaugural FOSROC Super6 Championship.

Boyle made his first professional start in last season's URC Round 2 clash against Benetton and scored his first try for the club in last April's EPCR Challenge Cup Round of 16 – a 41-19 rout of Bath at DAM Health Stadium.

Edinburgh Rugby Head Coach Mike Blair has welcomed the resigning of Boyle, a player who he says 'epitomises what it means to represent the city.'

Blair said: "We're delighted to see Connor re-sign with the club. As a local lad, Edinburgh Rugby means so much to him and you can really see that every time he pulls on the jersey.

"Representing the club means everything to Connor and that passion and intensity he shows when he takes the field is something other players really feed off.

"His behaviours epitomise what it means to represent the city, while he's shown real leadership potential by driving some of our off-field culture and standards.

"Connor is still a young man, and his game is still developing, but we're really happy with his contributions to the team so far. He's in a great place to kick on and become a top player for club and country."





# PRESS PASS WITH MIKE BLAIR



"It is amazing the different emotions you feel in this role. You are so happy for individuals because you know it is what they want to be doing, what they aspire to, it is also great because it means they are playing well for us if they are in the frame for Scotland, but there is a little tinge of: 'oh, we're not getting him this week'.

"But, ultimately, as coaches when you take the job you are aware of the different bumps we have to cross.

"So, it is great that those guys are away training with Scotland, but it also means our guys left here are going to have to step up and lead.

#### ON FACING A SA TEAM AT A 'BAD TIME'

"This is the thing with the league, luck plays a part in what you are trying to do because you don't know which players are going to be available to your team, and which are going to be available to the other team, and I believe that South African players have a got a rest period coming up but I don't know when that starts.

"Sharks have come over with a fully loaded squad for the Harlequins game in the Champions Cup and I can't imagine them making too many changes.

"It's similar to what we were saying about the selection of national players. It's disappointing that we don't get them but it's exciting for other guys who can step in and who haven't played as much this season, or who have been on the bench and are coming to us every week and saying, 'why am I not starting?'. Let's see how they go."

#### **ON LUKE CROSBIE'S FORM**

"He's had two Scottish Building Society Player of the Month awards in row. Hamish didn't play a huge amount for us last year.

"He kicked in more during that post-Six Nations time because he had a long lay-off with his groin and then there was the Lions stuff, so Luke got a good crack there and did really well.

"Likewise recently, Hamish hasn't been available but Luke has been playing some brilliant stuff and we want him on the pitch for us, he's a warrior of a player. He doesn't say a huge amount but his actions are fantastic."

#### ON CROSBIE'S BEST POSITION – OPENSIDE OR BLINDSIDE?

"I think he's equally [good]. We do things a little bit differently with how we run our back row. We drop them into where they suit with our lineout in particular.

"So Luke's done the eight role with our lineout before, whereas six, seven and eight off the scrum is obviously a little bit different.

"We'd happily select Luke at six or seven. He doesn't have a huge amount of experience as an eight off the scrum but I can't see why he can't do that as well."

"I thought Dave Cherry was also outstanding, I thought Grant Gilchrist was really abrasive, I thought Sam Skinner was really smart. Schoeman we all know about, WP playing 80 minutes, Bill carrying the ball, Jamie in amongst it – there were a lot of strong performances.

"Luke maybe didn't stand out as much as other guys because he's a grafter and you might see more of the other guys, but he's really important for us at the moment."



Edinburgh Rugby held on for a famous 20-14 victory over Saracens in a gripping Heineken Champions Cup Round 4 contest at the DAM Health Stadium on Sunday, but the English side secured home advantage in the Round of 16 thanks to their losing bonus point.

Both sides had the chance to book a home Round of 16 tie ahead of kick off, but it was Saracens who clinched the last allimportant top-four place in Pool A thanks to finishing the game within seven points.

Edinburgh now face a trip to Leicester Tigers in the Round of 16 in just over two months' time, while Saracens will host Ospreys.

David Cherry and Pierre Schoeman both crossed for Edinburgh, with Blair Kinghorn putting up 10 points from the tee. Saracens' solitary score came courtesy of Ben Earl while Alex Goode kicked three penalties. The visitors were hampered by ill-discipline, receiving three yellow cards over the course of the evening.

Edinburgh made a fast start and hooker Cherry crashed over on three minutes to give them a deserved lead.

Fly-half Kinghorn converted before nudging three-pointer moments later, though Saracens counterpart Goode got the visitors on the board following a scrum penalty on 16 minutes.

Saracens then saw hooker Jamie George and prop Marco Riccioni yellow-carded in quick succession, but despite being down to 13 men, they remarkably survived wave after wave of Edinburgh attacks.

After George returned, Saracens escaped their own 22 and another scrum penalty allowed Goode to reduce the deficit further. Saracens ended the half back at their full complement, and although Edinburgh were on the front foot once again, they couldn't notch any further points and took a 10-6 lead into the break.

Kinghorn and Goode exchanged penalties early in the second half, and as the tempo of the game went up a notch, Saracens received their third yellow card, lock Maro Itjoe heading off on 59 minutes for a cynical offside. Edinburgh capitalised on their extra man immediately this time, prop Schoeman burrowing over amid a rolling maul. Kinghorn converted but couldn't extend his side's lead moments later as his penalty held up in the wind and dropped short.


It was then Edinburgh who were down to 14 men as lock Sam Skinner was sinbinned for illegally bringing down a Saracens maul.

Edinburgh survived the immediate assault on their line, but a flowing Saracens move eventually put flanker Earl over in the corner.

Goode couldn't add the extras but, crucially, Saracens would be close enough to take a losing bonus point and clinch fourth in Pool A, ahead of Edinburgh only on tries scored.
