



JAMES LANG BACK IN THE MIX

After injury in pre-season caused a late start to the season for James Lang, the centre wasted no time in reintroducing himself to competitive action with a well taken try against Leinster

"It's been a long eight weeks of rehab", said Lang, "so it was great to be back out there at the weekend, blow out the cobwebs, of which there were a few.



"I did about half of the pre-season then got injured and missed the pre-season games which are always key to get your body right. You can't really replicate game fitness so it's always tough to get back.





"I tore my calf in training. It wasn't too bad but it took a good few weeks to get right and I didn't want to push it too hard with it being the beginning of the season but it's all good now."

Lang enjoyed an industrious performance from the bench in Dublin, creating space and beating defenders, while also crashing over for his second try for the club, supporting Charlie Shiel after Blair Kinghorn had created space for the capital men.



"Definitely. It's always great to play at the Hive in front of our fans. They've been great, all last season and this season as well.

"We want to put on a show and give them something to cheer about.

"We want to make this place a fortress. We know how important home games are and we need to win as many as we can. There are big challenges coming and we're ready for them."

Lang is also enjoying working with new Senior Coach Sean Everitt, and an adapted game plan that has built on the work of Mike Blair. "It was great to score because I don't get too many of them, but disappointed not to get the win or even two [bonus] points because I think they were up for grabs at the end.

"We were disappointed but we've addressed that and now look forward to this week against Connacht. It's a different challenge but one that we're relishing and definitely up to it."

A potential opponent will for Lang will be Bundee Aki in Connacht's midfield.

"I've never played against Bundee but I think the focus for us is how we play and imposing our game plan on them and hopefully we'll get the result."

Saturday's match is the first of three home matches on the bounce for Edinburgh, with the Bulls and Benetton to follow. For Lang, it's an important opportunity to get points on the board



"I think we've kept a lot of the stuff that Mike brought in over the last couple of years. It's more about the balance now, knowing where to play and not overplaying in what we call the grey areas in between the 10s. And in our own half we don't want to be keeping hold of the ball for too long and giving teams chances of turnovers or penalties to kick us back into our den.

"I think that's the biggest thing, the balance in our play, because we've got the attacking ability, we've got the players out wide and we've got the forwards up front so it's more just about having that balance and knowing when to play and pull the trigger."

Lang's role in the midfield includes trying to get the best out of Edinburgh's back three players. The former Quins man has enjoyed working with the capital's electric backthree options, and the strength in depth Edinburgh possess in the position.

"We're stacked and it's going to be a coach's nightmare when everyone is fit, trying to pick who to play. That's the beauty of having such strength in depth. You can give boys a few games and really go at it and you know they'll be guys who can come in and step up. So you've got to leave everything out there on the pitch knowing other lads will come in and do their job."



Opposition Preview

CONNACHT RUGBY

Edinburgh play host to table-toppers Connacht, with the Galwaymen having won all three of their opening fixtures of the 2023/24 BKT United Rugby Championship season.

Representing the Irish province of Connacht, the men in green ply their trade at the Galway Sportsground, and boast a rich history and tradition in the game. Founded in 1885, the westeners have regularly punched above their weight, with the province home to just over 8% of the total Irish population.

A crowning moment for the side was their triumph in the 2016 PRO12, defeating star-studded provincial rivals Leinster 20-10 at Scottish Gas Murrayfield.

The men in green enjoyed another successful campaign last season, before narrowly losing out in the BKT URC semi-finals away against the Stormers.



Last Time Out

Connacht took a resounding win at the Sportsground, with a Caolin Blade hat-trick inflicting a convincing defeat on the men from the capital.

The reverse fixture in 2021/22 saw a Blair Kinghorn-led Edinburgh side put the visitors to the sword at Hive Stadium, the hosts running out 56-8 winners.

The sides also met in the recent Scottish Building Society pre-season series in an entertaining clash at Hive Stadium - a glimpse into the excitement that can be expected at this Saturday's encounter.

Key Players

Connacht boast a number of high profile Ireland stars in their side, as well as a host of exciting up and coming talents.

The headline acts include key Ireland duo Bundee Aki and Mack Hansen. The pair featured heavily for Ireland in their World Cup campaign, and played a key role in the nation's 2023 Guinness Six Nations title win.

Away from their regular Ireland internationals, Connacht also have snarl in their back row with abrasive flankers Paul Boyle and Conor Oliver, with upand-coming Ireland star back rower Cian Prendergast

The Galwaymen play an expansive style of rugby, regularly looking to get the ball to back-three flyers Hansen, Tiernan O'Halloran, and John Porch.

With stardust across the park, they are steered by experience half-back pairing of scrum-half Caolin Blade, and experience captain Jack Carty at standoff.

Connacht are a team that doesn't go away. We know they've got that fight within themselves.

On Hamish Watson and injuries "It's a blow because he got player of the match against the Lions and he was doing pretty well against Leinster.

"Unfortunately he got that head knock pretty early and he did well to carry through until half-time. Losing a British and Irish Lion and a guy who has been in form is a loss to the team but it's a great opportunity.

"Connor Boyle came on at half-time against the Dragons and he could have walked away with the player of the match from those 40 minutes. "It's a great opportunity for the guy. Let's see if he can stake a claim to keep that No.7 jersey – that's going to be his challenge."

On Connacht

"Every week is a battle in the URC. We saw how Connacht can go with ball in hand in the first 40 minutes against us last season when we played them here.

"They had a good comeback against Ulster so it's a team who doesn't go away. We know they've got that fight within themselves and we know it's not going to be an easy team to play against. "The boys will be keen to bounce back and show what they can do against an unbeaten Connacht team. Every team is beatable, however, and we will be going out to get the win on Saturday."



On the search of an 80 minute performance

"The more the team plays together the better [we'll get]. We will try to get consistency in our selection so we can build cohesion.

"It's not been easy across the last few weeks as we had a different team against the Dragons to our last friendly against Bath. Then we had new arrivals and another two new players last week.

The more the team trains together and plays together – the better we'll get. If you look at how we played against Leinster and you talk about 80 minute performances, the effort was there but it was just our inaccuracy. "Sometimes it's not about the number of inaccuracies or penalties, it's about where you are conceding them. Unfortunately that played into their hands because we had dominance for the first twenty minutes and the last twenty.

"We just weren't good enough in the middle part of the game as far as the error rate was concerned. We've had a chat about it as individuals and they need to look at themselves and see where we can fix it."

Quick Hits Wes Goosen

I'm really enjoying the start of the season - loving just playing rugby again, to be honest, after the pretty average year last year with the injuries. But yeah, I'm loving playing for Edinburgh.

I feel like it's slowly coming back. I think it was about eight or nine months since I last played, so it was a bit of time. I'm happy, but there's still more to give and another level that I want to get to.

Scottish Building Society POTM Matt Currie

Edinburgh Rugby centre Matt Currie has been voted October's Scottish Building Society Player of the Month after an impressive run of performances in the capital midfield to start the 2023/24 campaign.

Starting in a new position of inside-centre, Currie has been one of the team's standout players in the opening three fixtures of the season, with Edinburgh Rugby securing hardfought wins against Dragons RFC at Rodney Parade and Emirates Lions at Hive Stadium.

Against Dragons RFC in Round 1, Currie was a constant threat with ball in hand while his tenaciousness in defence provided a sound platform from which the capital side were able to battle back and secure a road win.



Up against Emirates Lions, Currie continued to impress in the number 12 jersey with his explosive running off stand-off Ben Healy the difference in providing go-forward ball as Edinburgh Rugby made it two wins from two to start the season.

On being named October's Scottish Building Society Player of the Month, Currie said: "It was great to start the season off with two wins early on. Leinster was a bit disappointing, but I've still really enjoyed playing in the opening games and hopefully we can kick on from here.

"I've played most of my rugby at 13 but I'm enjoying the change at the moment and think it's always helpful to be versatile across a few positions.

"I missed most of last season due to injury so I'm just happy to be back playing and get a few games under my belt – whether that is at 12 or 13 I don't really mind."

36 Leinster27 Edinburgh



Despite a battling second-half performance, Edinburgh fell short in Dublin last weekend, with Leinster claiming a 36-27 victory at RDS Arena.

EEdinburgh threatened to grab two losing bonus-points with a late flurry of tries – however those efforts came up short as the capital side suffered their first defeat of the new campaign.

Edinburgh managed scores through three replacements – James Lang, Connor Boyle and Boan Venter – however those tries weren't enough to inspire a heroic comeback with poor first-half discipline at the root of the capital club's problems.

With Glen Young yellow carded on 30 minutes, Leinster were able to capitalise with an outbreak of simple scores scored from just a metres out.

With Lee Barron, Max Deegan and Ciaran Frawley all running in scores for the hosts, Edinburgh trailed 21-6 at the break. A pair of Ben Healy penalties – who remained perfect from the tee – kept the capital side on the scoreboard.

Edinburgh came out battling in the second-half and got back on the scoresheet with a coast-to-coast try.

With Blair Kinghorn breaking from inside his 22m, the full-back found supporting scrum-half Charlie Shiel.

From Shiel to the trailing replacement Lang, Edinburgh were back in it (28-13).

Leinster had proved too strong inside Edinburgh's red zone all afternoon however and they soon extended their lead with hooker James Culhane the try-scorer after another potent lineout drive (33-13).

Edinburgh weren't done however and with Connor Boyle adding the finish touches to a strong lineout drive, it was a 13-point game (33-20).

Edinburgh had further hope when Venter popped up with another close-rage score only moment later – however a penalty from Leinster's Sam Prendergast all but closed the door on the capital outfit's chances of a losing BP.

Edinburgh now turn their attention to a run of home fixtures in November with Connacht, Vodacom Bulls and Benetton Rugby all set to visit the Scottish capital in the coming weeks.
