JAMIE RITCHIE

100 UP

Scotland captain and back-row stalwart Jamie Ritchie will become Edinburgh Rugby's 40th centurion when running out against Benetton tonight.

It's fitting that Ritchie will join the club's distinguished centurions club on 'Club Appreciation Night' where he will likely wear Madras College and Howe of Fife RFC socks, two teams that played such a pivotal role in the Scotland skipper's journey to the top.

It has been at Edinburgh Rugby however – a club that, in Ritchie's own words:







'has been part of his whole adult life' – where the back-row has grown from a skinny and wildly courageous openside to a true leader that commands respect across the dressing room.

Having joined the club straight from school as a 17-year-old, Ritchie made his Edinburgh Rugby debut away to Leinster at the RDS Arena in October 2014 – and in truth, the former Scotland U20 has never looked back. "It's my tenth season, nine years. It has taken me a wee while to get to 100. I got to 50 in Cockers' first year. It has taken me a while since then, making it is really special," said Ritchie.



Ritchie continued: "I met with Sean just after we got back from the World Cup. It was one of the things we spoke about at the meeting.

"I said,' look, whether I am captain or not you will get the same from me in terms of how I will be around the place. If you decide not to make me captain that's fine, if you do, that's fine and whatever the decision I will support whoever is

"That is all I can do. The biggest part of leadership and captaincy for me is being yourself and that should not change whether you have the armband or not."

He added: "It is nice to concentrate on playing and be a bit more selfish in my preparation when I am here.

"This club has been part of my whole adult life. I have been here since I finished school when I was 17, and I've seen people come and go, but the club has been part of my whole adult life and it means a great deal to me.

"I have grown up here, so for me it will be a very special moment to run out for my 100th."

Ritchie returned to action for the first time following the Rugby World Cup in last Friday's bonus-point win against Vodacom Bulls.

Putting in an all-action 80-minute performance, Ritchie showcased why he is one of world rugby's brightest back-row talents, and without the captaincy in 2023/24 – with Grant Gilchrist and Ben Vellacott leading the team under Everitt – the openside flanker was able to 'just concentrate on playing.'



"And then it means if I am still captain of Scotland, I can throw all my efforts into that when we get back into camp."

Sean Everitt's side have enjoyed a hugely promising start to the new campaign, winning four games out five, with Benetton Rugby up next in the Scottish capital.

With Ritchie returning to the fray, the backrow is bolstered by a player who is a true difference-maker, and a player who is nearing 10 years of service for his boyhood club.

Ritchie has seen a lot change in decade of rugby in the capital, but now firmly believes the current crop is building towards 'something special.'

Ritchie said: "I hate to speak too early, but I feel we are building, and we have had some results that have gone to the death that in the past may not have gone our way, but we have found ways to win these games which is really good.

"We have a lot to work on in the meantime, but we are winning and learning which is great rather than off a loss.

"We are building in the right direction and there is a lot of confidence in this group in how we are preparing and coming out of the back end of results."

From schoolboy to centurion, Friday night is sure to be a special occasion for Ritchie and his family who are proud to call both the club and the city, home.

BENETTON RUGBY

Edinburgh play host to Scottish x Italian shield rivals Benetton Rugby, with the 'Leoni' arriving on an upward trend, and in dangerous form.

The Italian side ply their home rugby at the Stadio Comunale di Monigo in Treviso, and are playing some of the best rugby in their URC History.

Finishing 9th in the league last season, and making an EPCR Challenge Cup semi-final, the men in green and white have never been better.

A host of international talent, including Italy captain Michele Lamaro, feature for the Lions, and will provide stern opposition for the capital men.

We're also able to welcome back two familiar faces, in the form of club centurion Sam Hidalgo-Clyne, and former defence coach Calum 'Kitty' MacRae.



Last Time Out

Edinburgh and Benetton faced each other twice last season, with the home side winning out on both occasions.

The capital men put the Lions to the sword at Hive Stadium, with Duhan van der Merwe scoring a brace in a heavy win on his return to Edinburgh.

The reverse fixture was a closer affair, with Benetton holding on for a big win despite a brace of tries from Henry Immelman. With both sides putting out strong squads, it should be a close run affair on Friday night.

Key Players

The men in green and white boast a plethora of international talent in their squad, from Italy, Argentina, and further afield. In the front row the impressive Thomas Gallo starts, having enjoyed a successful World Cup campaign with Argentina.

Italy captain Michele Lamaro starts in the back row, a dynamic player and passionate leader, he is joined by the talented Lorenzo Cannone at number eight - a fellow Italian internationalist.

Familiar faces start in the backs, with Jacob Umaga at stand-off, and Paolo Odogwu bringing pace out wide. The pair joined from former English Premiership side Wasps, and both add electric spark to the Italian side's back row.

The Benetton midfield is also brimming with talent. Italy international Marco Zanon starts at 12, and plays alongside former all-black and URC Champion Malakai Fekitoa - a summer arrival from Munster.

On exceeding expectations?

"Not really with the group that we have and the preparation that they had prior to my arrival.

"There were a couple of things that we needed to sort out and I'm sure you'll have noticed that game management was one of them and the guys are managing the game a hell of a lot better than they did.

"But there has been a lot of learning. I just heard Jamie chatting earlier: he said it's a lot easier to learn when you're winning than when you're losing, and I think that's the most important thing, that they get into the habit of winning."

On Franco Smith

"Franco and I go back a long way. He was at the Cheetahs many years ago. I remember him as a player and coaching against him when he played against one of the local clubs in Durban.

"We have chatted a couple of times since I've been here. He's doing a good job at Glasgow and, as you can see, he had a major impact when he came.

"He was involved as a consultant with the Springboks at one stage and he was a front-runner for the coaching position there, so he's a well-respected coach and done incredibly well." The players want to learn and they want to get
better – they've certainly shown that although
the results have been tight at the end.
Hopefully that will help us later on in the
competition when you get to knockout stages
– if we make it there."





On scrum halves

"It is tricky. It's about balancing it and making sure you're giving everyone time in the saddle because you can't come in cold when you're needed.

"Fortunately, we've got three nines who can fill the role here and start at any stage.

"When we get to the two Glasgow games we'll probably show our hand on what our form side will be, what our championship side will look like.

"But it's good to be able to swap around and rotate like we have. So Ali will get a start sooner rather than later."

On Hamish Watson

"Hamish is back on the training field this week. He'll be involved in the team training later on, on Thursday, then he'll prepare well with us on Friday morning with the non-23, and then he'll be in full training next week and up for selection against Ulster."

On Darcy Graham

"At this stage it's doubtful for Ulster. We're not sure. If it's not Ulster, it'll definitely be Clermont [8 Dec]."

31 Edinburgh23 Vodacom Bulls



Edinburgh Rugby made it four wins out of five in the BKT United Rugby Championship, beating Vodacom Bulls 31-23 with a courageous display against the South Africans who had captain Marcell Coetzee sent off for a dangerous tackle on Pierre Schoeman.

Scotland captain Jamie Ritchie – playing his first game since the Rugby World Cup – was a dynamic influence on his team right from the start. And on-loan Glasgow Warrior Ali Price made his debut off the bench as Everitt's side held off a late fightback from the Bulls.

Johan Goosen created the try that gave the South Africans an eighth-minute lead with a grubber kick that was designed for winger Sergeal Peterson. Following up, Devon Williams dived on the ball to claim a simple score. Goosen added the conversion.

Then Healy sent a penalty to the corner and the pack drove from the lineout, with Ewan Ashman finishing off the try. The conversion attempt went wide, and it was still 13-11 at the break.

The second half had hardly got under way when Coetzee was sent off for barging into Schoeman's head with his right shoulder. The match officials had to watch half a dozen replays before the decision was made to show Coetzee the red card.

Bulls No 8 Cameron Hanekom was sent to the sinbin when Edinburgh attacked right from the restart. That penalty went to touch too, and from the lineout drive Ashman got try No 2. Healy missed the conversion attempt, but at 16-13 Edinburgh were in the lead for the first time.

Then with the Bulls still down to 13 men, Duhan van der Merwe got his team's third try. Mark Bennett and Kinghorn made the space, and when the ball got to the winger he had just enough time to dive in and score in the left corner. Healy's conversion came back off a post. Inside the last quarter, Bill Mata got the bonuspoint try from a Healy pass after a solid drive had the Bulls on their back feet. The fly-half converted to make it 28-13 – a score which looked like being a decisive margin until Elrigh Louw got one back for the Bulls from a tap penalty and former Edinburgh fly-half Jaco van der Walt converted.

The home side's eight-point lead then became five when, after Mata was yellow-carded for shoulder-to-head contact on Lions centre Stedman Gans, Van der Walt scored from the penalty. However, Edinburgh held their nerve and played much of the final few minutes in their opponents' half.
