




Back and ready to road

Edinburgh Rugby star Darcy Graham made his long-awaited return to rugby on Friday night, his comeback marked by a trademark diving score against Gloucester. The Scotland internationalist, known for his electric pace and try-scoring ability, has been out of action for nearly eight months due to injury

Speaking to media earlier this week, Graham could hardly hide his excitement at being back in the mix, a moment he'd been dreaming of for the better part of a year.

"It was really good to get back out there," said Graham. "It had been eight months, so it was really exciting. Going into it I knew I only had 40 minutes so I just wanted to get into the game nice and early and I managed to do that."

Graham's score saw him named Scottish Building Society Player of the Match on the night. His now familiar try-scoring song 'The Can-Can' rang around Hive Stadium, with Edinburgh supporters hopeful it won't be the only time they hear it this campaign.



"It was an easy enough finish," shrugged Graham. "Big Mosese got on that big jump line and brought in two defenders and Wes managed to take a nice pass off him and flick it out the back door as well. It was a standard finish for me."

His coach, Sean Everitt, has been effusive in his praise for Graham, calling him "world class" and one of the best wingers in the world. Graham, however, remains grounded.

"Obviously coming from your head coach it's a real nice compliment and to have that backing from him is massive, but I don't let it go to the head too much."

Graham has been ready to make his mark all summer, with his decision to miss Scotland's summer tour to The Americas a large part of why he's now in a position to make a splash from day one.

"Looking back at it, it was frustrating not to be going," said Graham. "But then in the grand scheme of things it was the right thing for me. I sat down with the coaches and spoke about it, and I would have been going on tour just straight out of rehab. I hadn't even had a full week of training at that point, so it would have been putting my body under extra stress which wasn't needed."

Despite his extended absence, Graham has no doubts about his ability to hit the ground running. With a full pre-season under his belt, and a hit out against Gloucester, Graham is now ready to embrace the challenge of wearing Edinburgh's number 14 shirt once again.



"I prepped in training for the whole pre-season so I knew coming back into the Gloucester game I was going to be fine. It's now just about getting that confidence back in and going into the contact.

"That's probably the big thing - carrying. When you're out of the game for a while you're watching it and it's so fast, it's so physical, the boys are massive and you forget a bit. So going back into it is a bit daunting."

"For me you just have to get stuck into it, and those 40 minutes were really good for me."

Looking ahead to this weekend's clash under thee Friday night lights, Graham is eager to go one further and play the full 80 minutes as Edinburgh open their URC campaign against the Irish giants.

"One hundred per cent," he continued. "For me, when I'm playing I always want to play 80 minutes. I want to be on the park but it's a 23 man squad, there's 23 of us on the team to do the game at the end of the day.









"It's a massive opportunity for us this weekend. I think we've had a really good pre-season, from where we were this time last year we're in a much better position. So it's about getting things right on the pitch on the day.

"Leinster have world class players all over the park and it's going to be no easy game. But it's just about focusing on us, bringing what we can bring. We know what they're going to bring, they're going to be physical, they're going to play and they're going to chuck the ball about and they're just going to do the basics really well.

"So it's just about us matching and then

being physical and hopefully getting one over them."

With his injuries behind him, and the URC kick-off only days away, Graham has a new focus and energy which have given him fresh perspective on the sport he loves.

"You never know when your last game is going to be," explained Graham. "It sounds cliched but you never know, one injury could finish your career. So it's just about enjoying the moments and taking a week at a time."

One week at a time starts with Leinster this Friday night, a match Graham will be desperate to light up.

Edinburgh Rugby centurion and the club's mostcapped centre of all-time, Chris Dean, is set to make a heartwarming return to Hive Stadium this Friday night as he delivers the match ball ahead of the United Rugby Championship opener against Leinster.

Dean, who left the club after a decade of service during the pre-season, expressed his excitement and gratitude for the opportunity to return in such a special way.

"It's a privilege to come back and be able to do a proper farewell, coming onto the pitch to deliver the match ball," he said.

"I guess for me it closes a chapter on a fantastic decade and being able to do it my own way is

really special. I'll be forever thankful for everyone that's been a part of my journey the last 10 years with Edinburgh Rugby. It'll be an exciting moment."

The former North Berwick RFC and Edinburgh Accies man will be joined by his daughters for the emotional moment, making it even more special.

"If my girls play ball, they'll walk on with me, which will be a really special moment," Dean added.

Reflecting on his decision to leave Edinburgh after ten years, Dean explained that he felt it was the right time to explore new opportunities both on and off the field.



"I felt like I really had given everything for 10 years," he said. "It's a daunting thing doing something for 12 years. I played professionally, I left school on the Friday and I joined professional rugby on the Monday, so to do that for 12 years and suddenly start to see on the horizon that it doesn't last forever, I think it was a really sensible move."

Despite his departure, Dean remains a passionate supporter of Edinburgh Rugby and is eager to continue following the club's progress.

"I think I was always an Edinburgh fan before I played and on Friday when I go and take my seat, that'll be me firmly a fan again," he said.

"And I think in the way that I've been able to finish on my own terms definitely cements the fact that I can't wait to just support the players that take the field on Friday night and thereafter."



"We didn't achieve our targets from last year, so for me we all know we are a team that can finish in the top eight, and we also know that we are a team that for the majority of the season sat in the top five."

"I think the club has gone through enough change over the last 12 months to also change leadership which is working really well.

"As we know, they complement each other. When Gilco is on international duty or needs a bit of a break, Ben steps in and takes over. It is good to have two leaders in the group.

"At times Ben has been on the bench behind Ali Price, so if Gilco comes off early then it is good to have a captain to come on at scrum-half, who is in line with the team and the plan, so it has worked well for us and the team enjoys the leadership."

On squad strength


"Last year was quite disrupted because we didn't have everyone here for the preseason.

"I know we have some people arriving later than normal, but we've had a minimum of five weeks together for everyone to prepare, which we didn't have last year and was really tough for the players.

"Last year we had guys coming back from the World Cup and having only two days to prepare before the Dragons game, so it is chalk and cheese to what we had. The numbers we have at training now is really different to what we had last year, so we are really well prepared."

On squad rotation

"The international players shouldn't play more than five [in a row]. My philosophy is that we should try to rotate players before we get to that point anyway and that's why I've pushed the depth in the squad.

"I suppose if we run into a spot of bother it's a discussion we can have with the powers that be but my job here is to look after the wellbeing of the players and if you look at the load that they are carrying in November added to the four games in December, I wouldn't be doing them any favours if I played all the players in my squad for more than five games in a row.

"I want a fresh squad, I want a rejuvenated squad and if everyone is playing within our group there is a lot more energy in the team room and the changing room so that's our goal."

"You probably looked at it as all-out attack, whereas it was more sort of mess around. We found ourselves getting turned over in our own half and leaking some weak points there.

"This is a no-fuss game plan, but the attack stuff goes hand in hand with what I've been working with down south for the past two years, so it's an exciting place to be.

I'd say I believe I'm a wee bit more mature. The way I played down south, and the way Bristol played, was a challenge to begin with. It was sort of sink or swim. I had to learn those soft skills, I had to learn how to play in the wide channels, be effective in there - not just carrying, but facilitating play as well.

"And I loved it. I loved playing that style down there. The Prem is attritional, so you've still got that physicality, you're still getting battered week in, week out. And I think I was shocked by that, because I was being told a lot by exiles - like Sam Skinner and those boys in camp - that the Prem potentially was something different. They weren't lying: it is tough.

"But that soft play, and the way Bristol wanted to play, has just developed me tremendously."

"Not a lot has changed, but that's why I came back. Some of the boys I've been pals with here for years are parts of the furniture now, like Mish and Gilly, Jamie, Chez, those sort of boys. It's good to come back in a squad like that - that same strong core group that really wants the best for the club. It's exciting to be part of it. I'm back in my same spot in the changing room, I didn't have to kick anyone out of that spot, which is good.

"Obviously there's a new coach and a new playing style and some system things - I've maybe still to pick up the finer details on that. What he talks about is a no-fuss game, so we're happy to exit, we're happy to kick the ball back, but we can also pull the trigger, which is slightly different to the way Mike, particularly Mike's first year, was when I left.





EDINBURGH RUGBY 33 - 26 GLOUCESTER RUGBY

A second-half comeback saw Edinburgh Rugby kickstart the season with a 33-26 victory against Gloucester at Hive Stadium.

Trailing 19-26 at the break, second-half tries from Tom Dodd and Dave Cherry secured the win, alongside some heroic defence from an all-new XV that was changed at the interval.

Darcy Graham grabbed a score on his return from injury while summer recruits Mosese Tuipulotu, Ross

Thompson, Matt Scott, Magnus Bradbury and Paul Hill all showed up well in a contest that was a real game of two halves.

Gloucester grabbed the first score of the evening as centre Max Llewellyn powered over after three minutes, finishing a cutting move which saw the hosts showcase plenty of power in the loose. Edinburgh hit back almost immediately with a beautifully worked score finished by the returning Graham.







With the ball in the Gloucester 22, quick service put Tuipulotu in space and the centre was able to find Graham who leaped into the Murrayfield end corner, bringing Hive Stadium to its feet.

A big hit from Tuipulotu – that forced his opposite man into touch – kept momentum in his side's favour, however the visitors were quick to regain the lead as Zach Mercer showcased his strength to muscle over.

With scrum-half Tomos Williams finishing a well-worked score, the Cherry & Whites extended their lead and looked to be building towards a sizeable half-time lead, but Sean Everitt's side showcased a bit of grit to cut the deficit.

With a strong lineout drive edging the capital pack within metres of the Gloucester whitewash, Bradbury was too big and too strong to be stopped.

With Gloucester adding another score from prop Afo Fasogbon, the visitors held a 19-26 lead at the break. Sean Everitt rang the changes at the break with an all-new XV and they brought the energy from the restart.

With Ben Muncaster and Connor Boyle bundles of energy in the back-row, it was another flanker Tom Dodd who wrestled over to level the encounter, bringing Hive Stadium to its feet.

With the hosts in the ascendence, the pack were turning the screw and with every hard yard and abrasive carry edging the hosts forward, Gloucester were in reverse as the ref started to whistle.

And when Healy nudged a penalty into the corner, Dave Cherry was the man who touched down to complete the comeback.

From attack to defence, Edinburgh were camped on their own line for the final 15 minutes however guts and courageous scrambling kept Gloucester out, giving the hosts a deserved Scottish Building Society pre-season win.

"There were a lot of pleasing things to take out of that and a lot of work we put in in the off season was on show, and that is what these games are for. It was also pleasing to see the newcomers have settled in well in the pre-season."
