





Talk is cheap

As Edinburgh Rugby prepare to face DHL Stormers in a crucial clash in the capital this Saturday night, the team is determined to bounce back from their disappointing defeat to the Emirates Lions in Johannesburg in Round 3 of the BKT United Rugby Championship.

Centre Matt Scott, now one of Edinburgh Rugby's most experienced campaigners, has been vocal about the need for the team to put their learnings into action and deliver a strong performance in front of the Hive Stadium faithful.



"The most disappointing thing was we started off poorly and weren't able to pull that back before half-time," Scott reflected on the Emirates Lions defeat.

"That is all on the senior players, the leadership group, the game-drivers – your nines and 10s. We have taken responsibility for not being able to address that after they scored their second try or third try and say 'lads, let's structure this game up a bit' because we were just playing right into their hands."

Scott acknowledged that the defeat was a valuable learning experience, despite the disappointment. "There were massive learnings," he said.

"It was a completely unacceptable performance by us. We've had a good review, but a lot of the boys have been saying 'talk is cheap, we need to start putting in performances on the pitch'."

This Saturday night's match-up with DHL Stormers is a crucial one for Edinburgh, and Scott emphasised the importance of a strong performance.



"It's such a massive game for us," he said. "We are not under-estimating that fact. I know this group has got fight. I see them every day and I have played with them. But I think the most important thing for us to win this game.

"If we stick to our plan and try our best and they are just better on the day, we can live with that.

"If you are beaten by a better team, you can hold your hand up and say 'fine'. Leinster and Bulls were games

that we probably should have done better in and we had some soft moments, then obviously it was a terrible first half at the weekend.

"The first three games of the season have been games where we have shot ourselves in the foot quite a lot, which is really frustrating."

As Edinburgh look to turn their fortunes around, Scott's words serve as a reminder that actions speak louder than words.

The team will be hoping to deliver a strong performance against DHL Stormers this Saturday night and prove that they have learned from their past mistakes.

In Round 4 (11-13 October) the BKT United Rugby Championship dedicates this weekend to promoting inclusivity in sport and supporting the Stonewall Rainbow Laces campaign in a commitment to ensuring our games are viewed as a welcome space for every person to enjoy.

The BKT URC and its teams believe that a club rugby matchday is 'Everyone's Game' and is committed to leading the way with the league's

clubs, partners, broadcasters and fans to ensure all of those engaging with our matchdays feel welcome and safe.

Taking place across eight venues, the weekend will start with Glasgow Warriors playing host to Zebre Parma at Scotstoun Stadium on Friday, October 11 and concluding with Dragons RFC playing against the Emirates Lions in Newport on Sunday, October 13.

LAST TIME OUT

EDINBURGH RUGBY 'A' 26 - 33 SARACENS STORM

Edinburgh 'A' succumbed to a narrow 33-26 loss away against Saracens Storm at Stone X Stadium.

The visitors trailed for large portions of the match, battling back from being 19-5, and then later 26-12 down to be level with the hosts, only for a late penalty try handed the Londoners the win.

Edinburgh 'A' went into the game with momentum behind them having toppled rivals Glasgow 'A' last weekend, however it was the hosts that raced out of the blocks to take the lead. Olamide Sodeke burst through the defence to score from 30m out with a minute on the clock, with the hosts quickly doubling their lead through winger Brandon Jackson.

The visitors didn't shy away from the task in hand despite falling foul to such a slow start, with Mikey Jones battling over to score and cut the deficit with 11 minutes on the clock. 14-5







Despite the score, Edinburgh were unable to wrestle back momentum in the match, with Jackson adding a second score after some loose passing enable to speedy winger to scurry free for extend the Sarries lead. 21-5

Edinburgh again showed their mettle, replying almost immediately to cut the hosts' lead. Scrumhalf Conor McAlpine, following a sharp performance last week, left the defence for dead with a smart dummy, before offloading to the onrushing Jerry Blyth-Lafferty to score. Cammy Scott added the first of three successful conversion to make the score 21-12.

After a frenetic five try start to the game, a period of calm took over, before the Storm burst to life once more to add control to proceedings. Kapeli Pifeleti broke free down the wing, and managing to find the onrushing Callum Braley – the Italy cap darting away for his side's fourth try. 26-12

With their backs against the wall Edinburgh 'A' again came out swinging, with Blyth-Lafferty getting his second score of the game. The hooker broke through a hole in the Sarries defence, and rushed over the line to close the scoring in the first half. 26-19

The men from the Scottish capital came out for the second half with a renewed sense of confidence, piling the pressure on the men in black and red.

McAlpine came close, held up over the line, when eventually Edinburgh were rewarded for their pressure on the hour mark, with centre Kerr Yule breaking free off the back of a maul score, with Scott adding the extras to level the scores. 26-26

The hosts managed to have the final say in the game, when a driving maul was brought down illegally for a penalty try. Edinburgh put on more pressure trying to salvage a draw, however it was the Storm who managed to hold out to take the win. 33-26
