
We're not going away

When the full-time whistle went on Saturday, Edinburgh Rugby co-captain Grant Gilchrist held a defiant gaze.

The lock, who crossed the whitewash in Saturday's emphatic victory of DHL Stormers, undoubtedly felt a sense of both relief and pride that his side had

bounced back and secured a much needed victory in front of the Hive Stadium faithful.

"We had all the answers in the room," he said. "It was just about making sure we used [the Lions defeat] as motivation."



"I didn't feel like we were under pressure to a level which we couldn't deal with or which was beyond us. But our job as always is to speak on the pitch on a Friday or Saturday.

"There's nothing you can say after a performance like we had in Johannesburg. It was unacceptable. We were really hard internally.

"Everybody has a right to their keyboard and to write whatever they like. They seem to be pretty sharp on Edinburgh, which I actually quite enjoyed because it has brought a real edge to us. That's an edge we're going to need for the whole season."

Gilchrist's try on Saturday was his first at home since 2018, and followed on from his try the previous weekend at Emirates Airlines Park.

"My strike rate over the course of my career needs a bit of work," laughed Gilchrist.







"But make hay while the sun shines eh? It's not really in my job description but we've been doing a lot of pick-and-go work and getting in. If it's something you can add to your game, I'm always looking for ways to improve. Long may it continue."

With a number of senior locks out injured, Gilchrist has played the majority of minutes in the capital engine room.

Gilchrist isn't complaining however and has relished the opportunity to step upas a senior player when the chips are down.

"I relish it. In big weeks for the club like last week, the senior guys have to stand up.

"We've got so much quality, so many you lads coming through, they just need the guidance and people with experience in leadership to stand up and give them the support to allow them to go and play with the freedom they can bring. "And I relish that. I loved the whole week last week because these weeks make you a better person and a better player, a better character and you learn a lot.

"As a senior player, it is about telling guys: 'I don't want anyone else – I just want the best version of everyone – I want the best version of myself, the best Ben Muncaster, the best Paddy Harrison – I don't them worrying about trying to save us all, they don't need to save anything – look around and look at the team and do your job – and the week you are under pressure is a real privilege and a real chance for everyone to grow'."

"I loved the way the boys stood up at the weekend, but it's not going to go away – so we're not going to go away."

Looking ahead to Saturday night's showdown with Cardiff Rugby, Gilchrist is determined to continue proving the doubters wrong.

"We started to [answer the critics on Saturday], but they're going to turn up again this weekend and it's about us proving everyone wrong every week from now until the end of the season," he said.

MARSHALL SYKES

BUILDING MINUTES AND MAKING EDINBURGH HOME



Edinburgh Rugby lock Marshall Sykes has enjoyed an impressive start to the season, featuring in all four rounds of BKT United Rugby Championship action.


The Scotland internationalist has been a key figure in the capital side's engine room, and his contributions have not gone unnoticed, with Sykes voted Scottish Building Society Player of the Month for September.

"Yeah, my mum made a lot of fake email accounts," joked Sykes. "No, it was good! As I say, it's tricky when you've won Player of the Month after a couple of losses, but at the same time, it just motivates you to keep pushing on and trying to improve performance each week."

Sykes has enjoyed increased playing time so far this this season, starting against Leinster, Vodacom Bulls and Emirates Lions in Rounds 1 to 3, before coming off the bench in Saturday's impressive victory over DHL Stormers at Hive Stadium.

"It was my goal coming into the pre-season to build minutes. I'm still not entirely happy with performances, there's obviously a lot to grow on."

The win over DHL Stormers was a significant boost for both Sykes and Edinburgh, with the capital side bouncing back from a heavy defeat in Johannesburg in Round 3.



With the pressure on to secure a win in front of the Hive Stadium faithful, Sean Everitt's side delivered.

"I think it was more of an expectation," continued Sykes. "I suppose you could say we put pressure on ourselves, because of all the external noise, but at the end of the day, the castle wasn't broken.

"We just had to get our stuff right. We knew what we had to do, and you could see that we put that out there against Stormers.

"Obviously it wasn't the complete performance, and that's what we'll be going for against Cardiff this weekend."

Sykes was particularly impressed with Edinburgh's execution and dominance in Saturday's 38-7 victory over DHL Stormers, which saw the South African side suffer their largest ever URC loss.

"Yeah, it was such a great feeling after Stormers. Even in the game, robotic isn't the word, but we had our processes, and we just kept rinsing and repeating it.

"I think we put pressure on them, and that forced a lot of errors, and got us to where we wanted to play, and you could see we were converting."

At the age of just 24, Sykes has already amassed 66 appearances for Edinburgh Rugby since making his debut during the 2020-21 season.

However, despite the knowledge he brings to the capital pack, Sykes admits he is still learning from more experienced campaigners like Grant Gilchrist and Sam Skinner.



"I'm still learning it myself. Obviously, I've got probably the physical side that I bring to it, but there's so much of the technical side I'm learning at the moment.

"Everyone in the second-row is real competitive. Yes, there's little bits, but I think in general, the locks, we've all got our own expertise. I think a big thing for us over the past couple of years is we try to help each other.

"There's no animosity between us if someone's picked and someone's not. It's just driving that culture of improving each other, because the more we compete, if someone gets dropped, someone's playing better, something like that, in the bigger picture, we're all going to play, but the team's going to win more."

Not just content with making waves on the pitch, Sykes has enjoyed plenty of recent highlights away from the rugby field too.

Having got engaged to long-term girlfriend Lucy in April, Sykes and his partner are more than settled in a city that he now calls home.

"I'm over the moon she said yes! It really is the old cliche of I feel like the luckiest man alive," explained Sykes.

"When me and Lucy moved to Scotland, I was 19 and Lucy was 18. It was pretty intense for a young couple to move during the heights of COVID.

"But no, Edinburgh is now home for us. We've got a little dog here, Barney. A little beagle, he keeps us on his toes. So no, we absolutely love it here.





"It's important for Scottish rugby that these youngsters get the opportunities and they certainly grabbed those opportunities that they've had with both hands, I think what's important for us is that these youngsters bring a lot of energy to the team. They're fearless in a way and they also want to make their mark in the URC and put their hands up for international selection. We're just proud of how they've stepped up.

"It's not easy when you're a youngster of 21 or 22 years playing in a big competition like this against experienced men.

"The opposition that they faced against the Stormers were immense and the guys that are seasoned campaigners and some of them Springboks in those positions too. So, I'm just proud of how they've done and hopefully they can build on those performances."





LAST TIME OUT

EDINBURGH RUGBY 38 - 7 DHL STORMERS

Edinburgh bounced back from last week's defeat in Johannesburg to secure their first victory of the United Rugby Championship season with an impressive bonus-point victory over DHL Stormers at Hive Stadium.

First-half tries from Patrick Harrison and Ben Muncaster set them on their way, while Ruhan Nel's try ensured Stormers were within seven at the break.

Edinburgh took control in the second half, with Darcy Graham and Grant Gilchrist crossing, as well as a

second Muncaster try, in addition to 11 points from the boot of Ross Thompson as the hosts ended their three-match losing run.

Edinburgh needed a response after last weekend's disappointing defeat and started on the front foot before their own fans. Gilchrist led the way by crashing over the line early, but further inspection from the TMO showed the captain had failed to ground the ball properly and the score was ruled out.







The home side did not let the momentum slip though, and Harrison burrowed over from close range for the opening try.

Stormers barely had time to gather themselves before Edinburgh struck again, Muncaster bursting through, stepping Leolin Zas and charging to the line for a wonderful try.

The South Africans finally came to life on the half hour, pounding the Edinburgh line until Damien Willemse sent Ruhan Nel crashing over to get the visitors on the board.

The momentum of the match had swung entirely, and only some ferocious Edinburgh defence kept the Stormers out in the closing stages of the first half.

The visitors kept coming after the break and Edinburgh had a let-off early in the second half. Graham was stripped of the ball in his own 22 and the ball was whipped wide to Zas to dive over, but the TMO spotted an infringement in the build-up and the try was chalked off.

Edinburgh gradually regained the initiative, worked their way up the pitch and got a little breathing space when Graham finished off a period of pressure to dive over in the corner.

Having scored his first Edinburgh try in six years against Lions last weekend, and having one ruled out early on here, Gilchrist clearly had a taste for the try line and he powered over from close range to secure his side the fourtry bonus point.

Muncaster ploughed over for his second try in the final play of the game to cap a superb player-of-the-match display.

Edinburgh Head Coach Sean Everitt said: "This team has never lacked character under my leadership. I'm just glad that they were able to put in the performance and get the result that they did against a quality Stormers outfit.

"It's been a difficult week for everyone. It was always going to be a tricky start, to this competition. But it just shows what this team can do with good game management and good leadership."
