








#### DOUGLAS STRUTH WELCOME





#### JAMIE RITCHIE

#### Maintaining momentum

Jamie Ritchie emerged from Scottish Gas Murrayfield battered and bruised on Sunday evening, having delivered a powerhouse performance in the Scotland back row.

His side's dominant and deserved win over Australia was a testament to his quality and relentless work rate. A constant threat at the breakdown, the performance was a reminder that Ritchie is one of the world's premier back rowers when on top form.

Now back with his hometown club, Ritchie is relishing the opportunity to maintain that winning momentum as Edinburgh gear up for a crucial clash with Benetton at Hive Stadium on Saturday night.



"I was really happy with the game and the result against Australia," said Ritchie.

"I'd say that performance was probably up there [in terms of his own game]. I think it was the first full 80 I've played for Scotland - not in the summer tour - since the South Africa game in the World Cup.

"It was nice to get through a whole game and feel like I was contributing. Certainly in the last year or so it was probably one of my best."

The switch from Test rugby to club rugby can often be jarring, but Jamie Ritchie has picked up right where he left off.

The Scottish international is a vital leader for Edinburgh and Ritchie knows his experience will be instrumental against a formidable Benetton side.

"I love being back in and seeing all the lads. Obviously, they had a couple of weeks off at the start, some of them were on holiday, so nice to hear about that. It sounds like they've been working hard the last two weeks and it was exciting to get going back in this week.

"The start of the season has been difficult in some ways. We've had some really good performances, so I think it's important to take confidence from those. But I think coming out of camp there's probably a few guys who have had a bit







of a freshen up. Some guys who have been here the whole time have had some time off and they'll be really raring to get back into games.

"So I think capitalising on that energy and then bringing in that kind of confidence that we've built up with Scotland and hopefully we'll be able to hit the ground running against Benetton."

Whether in the Scottish capital or the sunshine of Treviso, Edinburgh and Benetton have a history of thrilling encounters, regardless of location.

Edinburgh have historically held the upper hand at home, however with Benetton secure an upset smash and grab victory at Hive Stadium last season, Edinburgh will be eager to avenge the defeat and reclaim home advantage. "I think for us, it's probably the two games against Benetton that we were quite frustrated with from last year, so hopefully there's a little bit of redemption.

"What we'll expect, they kick the ball quite a lot. Obviously, we know Calum Macrae really well from his time here and he's really into his contestable kicking game, so with the law changes we'll expect to see quite a few of them. They also look to play a little bit of rugby, so we'll be expecting that.

"It'll be a massive defensive performance for us, which I think will put us in good stead and then when we have the ball, looking to get on the front foot. It's a massive fixture for us."

#### **BACK AT THE WHEEL**



Claire Cruikshank will reprise her role as the Edinburgh Rugby Women's team Head Coach for the upcoming Celtic Challenge.

Cruikshank steered Edinburgh to an impressive second placed finish in the team's inaugural season, and now take on the role in a full-time basis as part of the Scottish Rugby Female Performance Pipeline, funded by Royal London's Level the Playing Field programme enabled by the British and Irish Lions.

'Shanks' joins from the University of Edinburgh, where she has worked as Head of Performance Ladies' Rugby, where she has brought success for over a decade in the University game.

Cruikshank will continue to work in a strategic oversight role with the rugby performance programme at the University of Edinburgh, further strengthening the relationship with the club partner.

A former Scotland internationalist and stalwart of the women's game, 'Shanks' has international experience in a coaching capacity, both as Head Coach for the Swedish Women's National Team and as Head Coach for Scotland U20 since 2023.

Cruikshank was also World Rugby Coaching Intern for Scotland Women and the 2021 Women's Rugby World Cup in New Zealand and coached with the national team during the recent WXV2 campaign in Cape Town.



On the appointment, Cruikshank added: "It's a really exciting role, and I can't wait to get started. Last season's Celtic Challenge was amazing to be a part of, and to build on that is an opportunity I'm looking forward to immensely.

"It's great to see so many of our players from last season doing well, with many earning international honours after playing for Edinburgh. It shows the clear pathway that is available for the girls, and one I'm excited to continue working on."

Managing Director Douglas Struth added: "It's brilliant to have Claire back at the club for our second season of the Celtic Challenge.




Edinburgh Rugby Head Coach Sean Everitt is relishing the return of several experienced Scotland internationalists ahead of the capital side's crucial BKT United Rugby Championship clash with Benetton at Hive Stadium on Saturday night.

The likes of Darcy Graham, Jamie Ritchie and Pierre Schoeman are back in the mix, and Everitt believes their experience will be invaluable for the team.

"They've come back in today and done medicals after the Autumn Tests," he confirmed. "They're all available for selection against Benetton."

One player that has returned to the training paddock, having sorely been missed due to injury, is lock Sam Skinner.

"It's great to be back to URC action, playing in front of our fans at Hive Stadium."



"He's ready to go," Everitt said. "He's brought a lot of energy over the last couple of weeks. He's feeling like a new man now he's gone through an extensive rehabilitation. He can't wait to get on the field."

Skinner's return will bolster Edinburgh's pack, both physically and mentally.

"He's got a lot of experience, not only in the Premiership and Test rugby but he's respected here within our group. He's got leadership experience and he runs the lineout well too," Everitt added.

Another player making his way back to full fitness is James Lang, with the experienced centre knocking on the door for a return to acton.

"Likewise we've got James Lang coming back which adds to our depth and it is quite exciting for us going forward," Everitt said.





While the return of experienced players is a major boost, there are also opportunities for younger players ready to make their mark.

"There's also opportunities for youngsters over the next few weeks, like Lewis Wells, if we have any more injuries," Everitt noted.

One young player who has impressed Everitt is Freddy Douglas. The up and coming back-row is fresh off a month to remember having made his Scotland debut against Portugal before impressing in the recent 'A' team victory over Chile at Hive Stadium.

"We're monitoring [Freddy's] progress. I think he has done well. He is a youngster learning his trade but at the same time he's got an X Factor which is being able to jackal really well. I think he won five turnovers against Chile which does put him in the reckoning," Everitt said.

"Likewise we've got James Lang coming back which adds to our depth and it is quite exciting for us going forward."





#### LAST TIME AT HIVE STADIUM

#### SCOTLAND 'A' 19-17 CHILE

Scotland A secured a narrow victory over Chile in their first home match in 10 years, winning 19-17 at Hive Stadium on Saturday night.

Scotland opened their account quickly after being gifted a strong attacking platform inside Chile's half as Ross Thompson nudged a penalty for a line out inside the 22. With Chile not contesting it was an easy win in the air and quickly Ross McCann was able to find space on the right wing before putting full-back Arron Reed through a gap to cross the try line. Ross Thompson lined up the conversion but it was unsuccessful.

But it was an exciting start as Scotland A scored their first home points since 2014. After 10 minutes of interchanging play, Scotland were penalised for holding on in the ruck. With Chile just over the half-way line, they opted to kick for the points to get their account going however, Santiago Videla's shot was short of the mark.

The tides began to turn for Chile as they began to dominate in attack, spending the best part of 10 minutes inside Scotland's half. Jamie Dobie and Freddy Douglas proved themselves to be a real nuisance around the breakdown, constantly causing disruption to the visitors' platform.







However, it was Chile who would next disrupt the flow when full-back Luca Strabucchi got himself between Stafford McDowall and Arron Reed to intercept play. In football fashion he kicked the ball down the pitch, chasing as he went before dotting it down beneath the sticks for their first try. Santiago Videla had an easy conversion in front of the posts, which sailed over for the extras, giving Chile the lead for the first time.

Scotland suffered further misfortunate ahead of the halftime whistle as captain McDowall was shown a yellow card by referee Gianluca Gnecchi for dangerous clear out at the ruck, croc-rolling his opposition. This ruled him out for the remainder of the half and the opening two minutes of the second half.

The opening phases of the first half saw Scotland defending their try line well, with youngster Douglas, known for his impressive turnover rate at U20 level, doing just that to Chile just meters from the line. Just as Scotland tried to come back into the game, it was time for a break.

Chile were quick to make an impression in the second half and managed to take themselves up to Scotland's 22 for a line out. It was here that Scotland's Jamie Bhatti was penalised for tackling a player in the air. Capitalising on their position in Scottish territory, Chile's Santiago Videla stepped up to the tee once again and kicked a successful penalty to extend the lead for Chile.

After a back and forth 10 minutes neither side was really getting anywhere with penalties being conceded across both sides of the ball. But finally, there was a spark of magic for Scotland. As Chile launched the ball from boot into the sky, Ben Afshar was able to get hands on the ball and make a break, darting his way down the pitch from half way. With the crowd of Hive spurring him on it felt as though he had the legs to go all the way, but he was taken down in contact but Tom Dodd was fast behind him, and he gathered the ball to dot down.

On the hunt for another try and a more solid extension of their lead. After a series of penalties were conceded by Chile, Scotland had a line out on Chile's 5 metre line. The visitors were deemed to have collapsed the maul, and so, Scotland were awarded a penalty try.

Scotland seemed to be doing well controlling the final period of the match, however a misconnection in the backline as the final seconds played out saw Matías Garafulic intercept the ball and charge down the pitch to score under the sticks. Santiago Videla added the extras, closing Chile's account to 17 points and with it, the match. Although it wasn't enough to win, it was an impressive finish for the visitors.
