

DUHAN VAN DER MERWE


Here to stay

Edinburgh were able to announce the exciting news that world-class winger Duhan van der Merwe has extended terms with the capital club.

The deal will see one of world rugby's most exciting and dangerous attacking threats remain in the Scottish capital until Rugby World Cup 2027 at least.

Van der Merwe's extension is a major coup for the capital club, fending off interest from teams worldwide, with Scotland's current top try-scorer delighted to be staying at a club that has 'become his home.'

On re-signing, Van der Merwe said: "I'm delighted to commit my future to Edinburgh Rugby. This club and city are my home.



My wife and I love it here and I'm incredibly proud to represent the city and our supporters.

"I'd be lying if I said other clubs didn't express interest, but Edinburgh is home for me, and my connection to the club and our supporters were a massive driver in my decision to re-sign.

"I joined Edinburgh as a boy and the club has made me into the player I am today. I'm eager to continue writing my story here. I owe it to the club and the fans to give my all in the years to come."

Van der Merwe puts pen-to-paper ahead of a run of massive games for the capital outfit.

Edinburgh face Bayonne in Round 2 of the EPCR Challenge Cup this Friday night before back-to-back 1872 Cup derbies against Glasgow Warriors, with the deciding leg – already the fastest selling 1872 Cup clash in club history – taking place at Scottish Gas Murrayfield on Saturday 28 December (kick-off 3pm).

Van der Merwe is a true big game player and so often shines brightest in the 1872 Cup derbies where a famous brace of intercepted scores secured a famous intercity win back in December 2018.

Van der Merwe backed that up a 90m winner in last year's decisive derby, with Van der Merwe on track to make his 100th appearance in the opening leg of the 1872 Cup at Hampden Park.

He continued: "It will be a privilege to reach 100 appearances for such a historic club.

"Playing in the 1872 Cup is always special and I can't wait to represent this team when we return to Scottish Gas Murrayfield for the deciding leg later this month."

The winger has been a key figure for Edinburgh since joining the club from Montpelier in 2017. After notching up 10 tries in his debut season, Van der Merwe quickly become a fan favourite, known for his electric pace, powerful running and ability to score spectacular tries.







With 45 tries in 98 appearances so far, Van der Merwe is closing in on Edinburgh's all-time tryscoring record of 69 set by Tim Visser, establishing himself as one of the most prolific try-scorers in BKT United Rugby Championship history.

Van der Merwe's impact extends beyond the club level. He has been a key player for Scotland since he made a try-scoring international debut in the home win against Georgia in October 2020.

Van der Merwe's blistering form then brought about a 2021 British & Irish Lions call-up, during which he had the distinction of starting in all three Test matches.

The winger continued to make history during the recent summer tour to The Americas when he crossed the whitewash for his 28th Scotland try to become Scotland's record try-scorer. Van der Merwe grabbed his 30th Scotland score in the recent Autumn Nations Series victory over Australia to remain one try ahead of clubmate Darcy Graham [29] on the all-time list.

Edinburgh Rugby Head Coach Sean Everitt added: "We are absolutely thrilled to secure Duhan's long-term future at the club. He is a world-class talent who brings so much to the team. His ability to break tackles, score tries and create opportunities for others is invaluable.

"Duhan's experience will also be vital in mentoring our young back-three players. He's someone that our academy players look up to and I've got no doubt he will be able share the skills and x-factor he has developed over time to those players that will pull on the Edinburgh jersey soon.

He continued: "Retaining a player of Duhan's calibre is a testament to the club's ambition as well as the environment we've created at Edinburgh Rugby.

"His impact as a player is undeniable and we're excited to have him continue his journey with us. His commitment to the club is a significant boost for the team and our supporters ahead of a big run of fixtures for the club."

This week we announced the women's squad for the 2024/25 Celtic Challenge – which kicks off against rivals Glasgow Warriors next week under the Friday night lights at Hive Stadium (20 December, kick-off 7.35pm).

Head Coach Claire Cruikshank confirmed the final 30-player group, which sees familiar faces return for the side's second campaign in the Celtic Challenge.

Scotland internationalist and last season's Player of the Season Alex Stewart returns to the capital squad, the back-row set to feature for Corstorphine Cougars in this weekend's Arnold Clark Premiership final.

Other returning faces include Aila Ronald (hooker), Molly Poolman (tighthead), Natasha Logan (lock) and Merryn Gunderson (back-row), all of whom were been involved in Scotland women's squads since last season's Celtic Challenge.

Head Coach Sean Everitt is expecting a fierce European clash when Bayonne visit the Scottish capital this Friday night in Round 2 of the EPCR Challenge Cup.


The capital side go into the match-up – which is a repeat of last season's EPCR Round of 16 encounter – off the back of a tough opening match in Gloucester which saw Edinburgh take home a losing-bonus point.

Sean Everitt's side will be keen to get back to winning ways at home having picked up bonuspoint victories in their last three matches at Hive Stadium.

"We expect Bayonne to be full strength," said Everitt. "If they've set out to say that this is a competition they want to win, and they feel that they can, then I would expect them to bring the best team."

"Bayonne come into Friday night's clash having beaten Scarlets 17-16 in Round 1. The Basque side have been impressive at home in the French Top 14 – beating Toulouse, Stade Francais and La Rochelle – but have struggled on the road so far this campaign. Everitt continued: "Bayonne have recruited really well this year. You know, Manu Tuilagi is one of the big signings that they've made. And they rely on him to get going forward.

And they're a much-improved team, as I said earlier. They are a big challenge for us. With the X Factor players that they have, particularly in the back three. So, we're going to have to be fully switched on to be able to win this one."

With a number of the club's Scotland internationalists missing out on last weekend's tight defeat at Kingsholm due to rest protocol, Everitt is looking forward to getting some of those stars back in the mix at home.

"We're going to rotate in certain positions where we're able to. We are welcoming the Scottish internationals back from a break last week and thoroughly deserved. We'd like to get them into the mix this weekend.

For Everitt, European rugby is always is a special occasion with the opportunity for players to take on opposition and styles of rugby they have never faced before.

"Simply put, you're playing against teams that you don't normally play against," continued Everitt. "We did play Gloucester in a friendly. Other than that, we wouldn't play against Gloucester.

"We don't often get an opportunity to play against the Top 14 teams and particularly a team like Bayonne, who we played against last year, they've made big improvements and they're sitting fifth in the French Top 14.

"So it's going to be a good game and one that everyone's looking forward to."





LAST TIME AT HIVE STADIUM

EDINBURGH 50 - 33 BENETTON RUGBY

Edinburgh survived a second-half scare to claim a 50-33 bonus-point win over Benetton and move up to seventh in the BKT United Rugby Championship table.

The capital side were utterly dominant in the first half, scoring tries through Duhan van der Merwe, Ben Muncaster, Paul Hill and a double from Magnus Bradbury to lead 35-0 at the break.

Benetton mounted a strong second-half comeback, with two tries from Augustin Creevy and one for Paolo Odogwu, and although Ali Price crossed for the hosts, Alessandro Isekor and Malaki Fekitoa scores ensured a nervy finish.

Muncaster grabbed his second try late on and Ben Healy kicked a penalty to ensure Edinburgh held on for the deserved win.

The game was barely a minute old when a slick backs move put Edinburgh full-back Wes Goosen through a gap and he fed Van der Merwe to race home for the try.

The second was not long in coming. From a messy line-out on the 22, Muncaster gathered the loose ball, powered through several tackles and stretched for the line to score.







Bradbury crossed for his second moments later as Edinburgh wrapped up the bonus point before the 25-minute mark.

Prop Hill then pounced on a loose ball to charge home for a try in the final play of the first half to round off a one-sided opening 40 in blustery conditions.

With the strong winds behind them, Benetton finally showed some signs of life early in the second half – Odogwu and substitute Creevy crossing in quick succession to check the home side's momentum.

What looked like a fleeting show of defiance threatened to become something more when Creevy ploughed over again to make it 35-19.

Edinburgh restored some order when Darcy Graham skipped his way through and popped a pass off the deck for Price to score.

Benetton kept coming though, propelled forward by the wind, and flanker Izekor forced himself over to bring his side back within two scores. Fekitoa then went over for the Italians' fifth try and it was game on at Hive Stadium.

The capital side showed great character to close out the match however, with Muncaster going over from close range for his second try and Healy splitting the posts off the tee to secure a 50-point victory.
