

WES GOOSEN

Goosen find his home at full-back as Edinburgh eye European glory

Wes Goosen committed his future to Edinburgh Rugby earlier this week, signing a new two-year deal that will see him remain at the capital club until 2027.

With the full-back set to make his 50th appearance in Friday night's crucial EPCR Challenge Cup Round of 16 clash against Emirates Lions, Goosen's commitment and form are a timely boost for Edinburgh who will be aiming to secure a home Quarter-Final.

For Goosen, the decision to extend his stay at Hive Stadium was a straightforward one. "It was actually quite an easy decision, really," he explained. "I'm loving my time here, loving being under Sean here, and really enjoying playing full-back. Yeah, so it was actually quite easy. I'm quite settled down in Edinburgh, so I'm pretty happy."



Reflecting on journey since joining Edinburgh in 2022, Goosen feels he has truly found his home in the Scottish capital.

"I just kind of take it as it comes. My first season I felt I didn't really achieve what I wanted to - I was injured a lot. I wanted to make up for it last season. I really enjoyed last season, so I wanted to come back.

"I really enjoy playing for Edinburgh, and I feel like there's so much more to be done here. We can win competitions, there's a lot of potential, a lot of people are staying and I want to be a part of it."

This season, Goosen has been a key figure, playing every minute of every game, a testament to his durability and mindset.

"Yeah, I think I came off my foot at the end of last season. I came back, and had a bit of a slow start, but I feel like I'm slowly starting to hit my groove now," explained Goosen. "My confidence is back and I'm really enjoying it - I'm really enjoying the counter-attack side of the game that we're pushing. It's a lot of fun."

Goosen has also found a new home at fullback, a position he believes suits his skillset perfectly, with the playmaker so solid under the high ball and dangerous when counterattacking alongside back-three threats like Darcy Graham and Duhan van der Merwe.

"I think full-back suits me more, the playmaking kind of set-up side, but also to have a go myself, punch. I've really taken to it," said Goosen.

I really enjoy setting up people - I guess when you've got Darcy and Duhi on the wings it's really quite easy. Yeah, I think full-back is hopefully my new home."

His consistent presence on the field, playing every minute, speaks volumes about his commitment to the jersey, with his Head Coach Sean Everitt describing Goosen as a player who 'embodies what the club looks for in a non Scottish qualified player.'

Goosen added: "Before that unlucky first year, touch wood I've never really had that many bad injuries. I've been able to play a lot of games, and I've always said if you make yourself available it's the best thing in rugby you can do, is be available to the coach and to your team-mates.

"I guess at the start it was a lot of minutes, but I'd rather be playing the game than not, or running line to line. I'm loving it."

With a crucial period ahead, Goosen is focused on making the most of the opportunities that come his way as Edinburgh continue to fight in both the URC and EPCR Challenge Cup.

"Yeah, big few weeks. We spoke about it. I guess you go to this comp, EPCR, take one game at a time. You take the Lions, hopefully, you look forward to the Bulls or Bayonne.

"And then back into the URC and it's pretty much play-off rugby every game. So it's exciting and I guess that's the rugby we want to play, is knockout rugby."

Secured with a new deal and settled at fullback, Goosen is poised to be a pivotal force in Edinburgh's decisive campaign stretch.

PIERRE SCHOEMAN CONSISTENCY IS KEY

The consistency of us as a club, that's what people always question, And I think this is a brilliant time to show it now [with a run of] a few home games.

"We learned a lot against the Dragons, I mean, we got the five points, but it's not nearly as good as we can be.

"We know the South African boys – they'll be hurting from that [Glasgow loss]. They're going to really leave everything out there before they return back from the UK. They're going to come full steam and they're going to remember the previous game at Ellis Park – but so do we and we have to take confidence in learning.

"We can learn a lot from the way Glasgow played the Lions – the speed of ball and contact area and then discipline. Discipline is key. We haven't been really good at it, but we're getting better now. 



PRESS PASS SEAN EVERITT

Edinburgh Rugby are gearing up for a crucial EPCR Challenge Cup Round of 16 clash against Emirates Lions at Hive Stadium this Friday night, with Head Coach Sean Everitt keen to see his side demonstrate the lessons learned from their previous encounter in Johannesburg.

Edinburgh were well beaten by the Lions in October, fuelling a desire for redemption. "I think we learned valuable lessons there in the first half against the Lions," Everitt reflected.

"We saw Glasgow blitz them as well in the first 40 minutes in really difficult conditions."

However, Everitt is wary of reading too much into the Lions' recent heavy defeat to Glasgow Warriors in which the Scotstoun side led 42-0 at half-time.

"I know the Lions really well and I know the individuals there, they're fighters. They've been good in the URC up until that game so you can't judge them on that game. They're a good all-round team."

He highlighted the Lions' resilience and attacking threat, noting, "The defence was strong and they showed that in the second half against Glasgow and they've got some X-Factor

players there that can turn the game around very quickly which we found out in Johannesburg.

"It's a difficult team to play against and at the same time I'm sure they're going to be looking to bounce back because they probably feel a bit embarrassed about that result. Like I said, it's not because they're the Lions but they take a lot of pride in their effort."

Despite the Lions' result against Glasgow Warriors, Everitt maintained that his team's preparation remained unchanged.

"No, because that doesn't change how they play. Like I said to you before, they're a team on the up," explained Everitt.

"They're a bunch of youngsters. They don't have any fear and they're willing to mix it with everyone. I think everyone is probably surprised by how well they've done so far in the URC. In the URC they've got a lot to play for.





"They're going home post-EPCR and they've got four home games. So they'll probably be looking at a top four if results go their way. And it's not far off because everyone's got to play each other in the comp. The Sharks have to tour and they're sitting in fourth position. So they've got a lot to play for. But they'll also be keen to get their hands on that trophy as well."

While the competition shifts to the EPCR Challenge Cup, Edinburgh's mentality remains unchanged, with every game approached as a crucial knockout fixture.

"We're in a knockout week, every week, so we're in the same situation as we were last year," Everitt explained. "I think from a personal point of view we're better off. We've created depth since last year this time. But it's becoming the norm now. You wake up, try your best, prepare every day to be better and hopefully you perform well on Friday night."



LAST TIME OUT

EDINBURGH 38-5 DRAGONS

Edinburgh Rugby delivered a commanding performance at Hive Stadium this evening, dispatching Dragons RFC 38-5 in a crucial BKT United Rugby Championship clash.

The six-try victory propelled the capital side back into the playoff positions, securing a vital bonus point and lifting them to 6th place in the table. Despite an early intent, Edinburgh initially struggled to break down a resolute Dragons defence, with the midfield battle proving particularly fierce.

Early setbacks saw Marshall Sykes and Duhan van der Merwe forced off with knocks, disrupting the home side's rhythm. However, Edinburgh's persistence eventually paid off. A penalty kicked to the corner set the stage for the first try, with hooker Paddy Harrison powering over from a well-executed lineout drive.

Harrison soon doubled his tally, showcasing his pace after Darcy Graham chipped over the top, allowing the hooker to gather and race away.

Graham, who ultimately earned the BKT Player of the Match award, then turned scorer, collecting his own clever chip over the Dragons' defence to add a third try.



The visitors' woes deepened when Ashton Hewitt was sent to the sin bin, and Edinburgh capitalised immediately. Pierre Schoeman crashed over from close range, securing the bonus point before the interval and giving Edinburgh a commanding 26-0 lead at halftime.

Dragons emerged from the break with renewed vigour, and Aaron Wainwright managed to breach the Edinburgh defence to put the visitors on the scoreboard. The second half, however, became a scrappy affair, with both sides struggling to maintain possession and create clear-cut opportunities.

Edinburgh eventually regained their composure, with replacement prop Boan Venter driving over in the 65th minute to extend the lead to 33-5.

The home side then wrapped up the scoring with a well-executed backline move, culminating in Matt Currie diving over in the corner to seal a 38-5 victory.

The bonus-point win was a significant boost for Edinburgh, propelling them back into the top eight and playoff contention.

With their confidence high, Edinburgh now turn their attention to the EPCR Challenge Cup Round of 16, where they will face Emirates Lions at Hive Stadium on Friday, 4 April.
