

Good evening, and welcome back to Hive


While we missed being at home, the international breaks are always a proud moment for our club, being able to witness the people we see week in week out representing their country.

Scotland international hooker Ewan Ashman was named Scottish Building Society Player of the Month for October, claiming the public vote after an impressive month in the capital.

The hooker has started the season in rampant form, continuing his run that saw him selected for the British and Irish Lions in the summer.

Ashman has always been known for his rollocking ball carrying, putting in massive shifts against Zebre and Munster in particular, but has also added new levels of set piece accuracy to his game, hitting his man 92% of the time so far this campaign.


After the rugby, they gather upstairs in the clubhouse for a well-earned cuppa, sharing stories and reliving the great matches of years gone by.



# WES FIRES UP GOOSEN FOR OSPREYS CLASH



The roar of the crowd at Scottish Gas Murrayfield is nothing new to Wes Goosen, but for the last four weeks, his role has shifted from player to passionate spectator as he took in the Quilter Nations Series from the stands.

Now, with the sights and sounds of the Autumn Internationals firmly in his memory, the electric playmaker is buzzing to get back into the thick of it, starting with a crucial clash against Ospreys this Saturday night at Hive Stadium.

Goosen, whose journey to Edinburgh has brought him from the deep rugby heartlands of New Zealand, used the recent break to recharge and reconnect with his roots. "I had a break. It's been quite nice," he reflects on the change of pace.

That break included a distinctly Kiwi flavour when the All Blacks came to town. "I caught up with the All Black boys when they were over here. I've got a few good mates in the team. A few dinners, I went for a few beers after the game with them, so it was actually quite nice."

The reunions were frequent and fulfilling, catching up with former Hurricanes teammates like Billy Proctor, Jordie Barrett, and Du'Plessis Kirifi. "It was very nice. We all used to play in the Hurricanes together, so it was nice to catch up properly. I saw them about four or five times."

Among those meetings was the experience of watching Scotland take on the All Blacks right here at Scottish Gas Murrayfield.

"They actually gave me some tickets. They all love it here in Scotland. They love the city, they love playing here, they love the crowd. So it was awesome," continued Goosen.

But what really struck a chord was the atmosphere generated by the home support. "It was really good. It reminded me of when we play Glasgow here at home. It was so loud, such a cool experience to hear the crowd singing Flower of Scotland. Yeah, it's amazing for those players to experience that."

Goosen even confessed to fully immersing himself in the spectacle, saying, "I did, yeah," when asked if sang both anthems. experience, he admits, offered a glimpse into potential a international future with Scotland. "I guess it does give you a little bit of a taste. I just take every day as it comes, but it's a one-of-a-kind experience here at Murrayfield."



Now, the focus snaps back to club duties. "Yeah, I can't wait to play. It feels a bit weird having those four weeks off. You want to win, you want to right those wrongs," he says, feeling the competitive urge return.

"It almost feels like an end-of-season break. Everyone has come back keen, you've got the Scotland boys coming back keen, we're all in it together."



The return of the international contingent, fresh off a tough run, brings an immediate expectation for them to slot back into the club's rhythm. "The expectation is that we pick them up. They've had a tough four or five weeks of international rugby, so they've got to come to our standards instead of them easing into it. We lead and they have to follow."

He notes that leaders like Grant Gilchrist set the immediate tone: "To be fair, all those boys, like Gilco, he comes in straight away and he leads."

This return to the field at Hive Stadium is more than just a welcome back; it's a pivotal moment in the URC campaign.

"This game here is a must-win for us. We're excited to be back here at the Hive," Goosen asserts.

Despite a few close calls, the team knows where they stand. "We've had a few close losses, but if we win this game we get our season back on track. If a few things had gone the other way we could have been sitting a lot different."

With refreshed bodies, renewed purpose, and the echoes of Scottish Gas Murrayfield still ringing, Wes Goosen and Edinburgh Rugby are ready to make a statement this Saturday.

# EVERITT: READY FOR A COLOSSAL RUN



EDINBURGH HEAD COACH SFAN EVERITT

Edinburgh Rugby Head Coach Sean Everitt says his squad is reenergised and champing at the bit to get back into BKT United Rugby Championship action as the club prepares for a monumental festive and New Year period packed with high-stakes fixtures, including the showpiece 1872 Cup derbies.

Following the international window, the focus has entirely shifted back to the club's URC campaign. Everitt is delighted to have a large share of players back together and fully committed to the task at hand.

"It's been a good period to reset, but make no mistake, all eyes are now firmly on the pro game," said Everitt. "We've got a core group of players who have been working relentlessly, and it's a massive boost to have some of our internationals back too.

"There is a great energy around the place at the moment. This club is about collective success, and the next few weeks are critical for us to make a statement in both the URC and Europe."

The colossal run of 10-straight weeks of fixtures begins this Saturday night with the visit of Ospreys to Hive Stadium. With one home game postponed, Everitt is keen to build on the momentum following the brilliant 43-0 win against Benetton in front of the capital faithful.

HEAD COACH PREVIEW "Playing only one official home game has been challenging, but we're keen to continue our good performances at Hive Stadium, feeding off the energy of our supporters and we have missed them.

"This Saturday is a chance to put a marker down. However, the Ospreys are a top-class side, exceptionally well-coached, and they'll be coming to Edinburgh with fire in their bellies.

"We know it'll be a tough, physical battle, and we have to be on point from the first whistle."

The illustrious Investec Champions Cup also returns in December with a blockbuster home opener against French powerhouse RC Toulon – a fixture Everitt believes will be a massive test and a celebration of the club being back at the top table of European rugby.

"European rugby at this time of year has a special kind of magic. Being back in the Champions Cup is huge for us, and drawing a team like Toulon first up at home is simply outstanding," he said.

#### EVERITT: READY FOR COLOSSAL RUN



"There's always a special feeling about taking on French giants in our own backyard. It's a physical challenge, a tactical battle, and an atmosphere unlike any other. It's exactly where this club wants to be, testing ourselves against the best."

Attention then quickly turns to the mouth-watering 1872 Cup double-header against Glasgow Warriors
– games which always bring an extra layer of passion and meaning over the festive period. "The 1872 Cup fixtures are unique, and they are the jewel in the crown of this colossal run," stated Everitt. "There's just something about playing your biggest rivals over the holidays that makes these games mean more.

"It's a battle for bragging rights, for the city, and a chance to truly test yourself under immense pressure. We'd love to get our hands back on that trophy, and to do that, we need to bring our absolute best."

## LAST TIME OUT

#### CARDIFF RUGBY 20 - 19 EDINBURGH RUGBY



Edinburgh Rugby suffered a late 20-19 defeat at the hands of Cardiff at the Arms Park on Saturday night, falling to a last-gasp penalty after a free-flowing contest.

The visitors held the lead for the majority of the game, only to see it snatched away in the dying minutes by the boot of loan Lloyd.

Edinburgh burst out of the blocks, executing a clinical opening score after just three minutes.

Fly-half Cammy Scott delivered an inch-perfect cross-field kick into space, which winger Lewis Wells gathered in his stride to touch down for his first try for the club, giving Edinburgh an early 5-0 lead.

However, the hosts hit back almost immediately. Following a deep Edinburgh clearance, the home side broke well down the short side, culminating in scrumhalf Johan Mulder finishing off the move. The subsequent conversion drifted wide, leaving the scores tied at 5-5 after a breathless opening seven minutes.

The seesaw nature of the contest continued as Edinburgh quickly regained the initiative. A penalty won straight from the restart by the impressive Liam McConnell allowed the visitors to march back downfield.

After battering the Cardiff try-line through several phases, scrum-half Charlie Shiel managed to spin over the whitewash to retake the lead at 5-12.

Just as Edinburgh looked set to march on, following a scrum penalty on halfway, Cardiff launched an attack from deep within their own half.

The length-of-the-field break was finished off by Welsh international Josh Adams, who dotted down to level the scores once again, making it 12-12 after only 15 minutes of exhilarating rugby.

Despite the punishing nature of the exchanges, Edinburgh managed to seize the lead again shortly after. British & Irish Lion hooker Ewan Ashman wrestled over the line after 19 minutes for the visitors' third try.

With James Lang adding the conversion, the score settled at 12-19, which would remain the deficit as the teams headed into the sheds for half-time.

The second half brought a significant change in conditions, with a strong wind and rain sweeping across the pitch, leaving Edinburgh to play into the elements.




Cardiff utilsied the wind well and managed to breach the Edinburgh defence for their third try of the evening when former Edinburgh prop Javan Sebastian powered over in the corner. Crucially, the conversion attempt drifted wide, allowing Edinburgh to retain a slender two-point advantage at 17-19.

or the middle period of the second half, Edinburgh held their nerve and maintained pressure, despite the fierce defensive effort from Cardiff. With the two-point lead intact, it became a tense battle of attrition, but Cardiff's defence held firm against repeated waves of attack. The drama reached its peak in the final minutes when the hosts secured a crucial penalty on the halfway line. Outside-half loan Lloyd duly dispatched the long-range kick, giving Cardiff a 20-19 lead with just minutes remaining.

Cardiff successfully negotiated the final moments, holding on for a dramatic and narrow one-point victory.
