

It is a fixture that conjures up special memories for Edinburgh Rugby fans, and for double-centurion Grant Gilchrist, the anticipation of facing RC Toulon in the Investec Champions Cup opener this Sunday brings a rush of nostalgia and motivation.

Having been part of the squad that secured famous home and away victories against the French giants back in the 2018/19 season, Gilchrist is eager for the current squad to replicate that success this Sunday at Hive Stadium.

Reflecting on those famous wins, Gilchrist said: "Like they are now, they were a big, powerful side. We fronted up well up front, we gave ourselves an in in the game, and then we scored some brilliant tries.

"The one that sticks in my mind is Jimmy Johnstone's over there. To go to the Mayol and win is huge. It's a special memory to the boys that played."

He singles out Bill Mata's moment of magic: an offload at full speed with several defenders around him that saw James Johnstone collect and finish from 30m. That score, he insists, still gives him a thrill to this very day.



"It's probably one of the best tries I can remember. Just absolute magic from Bill [Mata], but I think Jimmy's take - the way he took it on the back shoulder. They're up there."

This Sunday, however, is a new chapter. Gilchrist is determined that the team meet the challenge head-on and make the most of the Champions Cup thrill.

"It's three years since we've been in the Champions Cup, so getting that opportunity to test yourself against the best is really important to this club. And for our supporters to come on Sunday and watch us take on one of the best teams in Europe is what it's all about. It's a big week for us."

The scale of the competition brings an essential extra edge to the week's preparation.

"There's just got to be an extra edge to everybody this week, because we know that level is another step up. It's something that we aspire to get to," Gilchrist explained.



He and other experienced players are ensuring the whole squad understands the step up in intensity. "The opportunity this week is one that we've got to go out and grab with our preparation and make sure that we don't come to Sunday night and go 'Ooft. We weren't ready for that'."

The Scotland lock acknowledges that winning first requires beating Toulon at their own power game first, before attempting to unlock them with speed.



"The biggest thing is we're going to have to front up to the physicality just to gain access to this game. We're going to have to defend well enough, our set piece is going to have to be good enough."

"That's the opportunity we have here. Can we front up physically to their power? And can we cause them problems with our speed, and playing on a surface that's unfamiliar to them and a style of rugby that we play a lot in the URC and they don't. They play that power game. Can we offer them something different and challenge them in that way?"

The environment at Hive Stadium will be electric, and Gilchrist is counting on the supporters playing their part.

"It's special. It was a huge goal of ours to get back into the Champions Cup, so now that we're here, and playing at home against Toulon, one of the biggest teams in Europe. If you can't get excited about playing this week, then you're in the wrong place.

"I'm sure our supporters will be excited about the prospect of seeing their team go up against one of the big dogs. And for us it's about making sure that we get our stuff right and we represent ourselves in the way that we know that we can. And if we do that, we want to win the game."

EDINBURGH HEAD COACH SEAN EVERITT

Edinburgh Rugby Head Coach Sean Everitt is relishing the challenge as his side prepares to kick off their European campaign this Sunday, hosting French giants RC Toulon at Hive Stadium.

The capital club returns to the elite Investec Champions Cup, and Everitt sees the opening round fixture as a crucial measuring stick for his squad.

"Yes, it is [an exciting weekend]," he said. "I think the guys are excited to be back in the Champions Cup. One of the biggest competitions in the world. Playing against the best opposition in the Top 14.

"It's great to be able to measure yourself against the French competition. At the same time, for us, it's a good benchmark to see where we are and how important this win will be if we want to make the last 16 in the competition."

Toulon, three-time European champions, pose a formidable test, despite recent struggles on the road. Everitt acknowledges their quality and the need for Edinburgh to be at their absolute best.

"It could be [an opportunity]," the coach said when asked about Toulon's indifferent away form. "It depends on what they're sending. They played Montauban on the weekend... I don't know what team they'll send to us. There's a seven-day turnaround. They only play the following Sunday as well. So it's a little bit different for them. But at the end of the day, we know the squad that they carry. We'll have to be on top of our game to win it."

HEAD COACH PREVIEW

EDI TLN

When assessing the primary dangers from the French side, Everitt highlighted their forward power and key individuals in the backline.

"Well, their pack is massive. Melvyn Jaminet is a kingpin for them. He's good under the high ball and got a good kicking game. But one-versus-one, they are a dangerous team.

"They like to keep the ball moving. They're big on the continuity to be able to pick off individuals. So it's going to be a good day defensively for us, but we need to play at speed at home."

For team news, Edinburgh are boosted by the return of key Scotland internationals for this European opener, though they face disruption in the back row.

Everitt confirmed that winger Darcy Graham and hooker Ewan Ashman are both available for selection this weekend.

"We're not resting this weekend. We want to try and pick the best team that's available to us on Sunday," he stated. Everitt added that the team selection was "pencilled in" before last week's fixture but was finalised after assessing player form and fitness.

"We obviously wanted to see how some of the guys came through on the weekend, from a form point of view, because we're trying to pick the best team that we have available to us. So there will be a couple of changes this weekend."

Unfortunately, young back-row forward Tom Currie will be sidelined for a few weeks due to a knee injury picked up against Ospreys,

while fellow back-rower Ben Muncaster also tweaked his MCL but is expected to be available next week.

Everitt expressed sympathy for both players. "Ben hasn't had much luck. Likewise Tom, he hurt his knee in the 18th minute of the game and he tried to push through.

"Obviously after half time I took him off. He just couldn't do it anymore. It's a pity for him, a guy that hasn't had much starts in the number 8 jersey and making his mark. I thought he had done quite well up until then."

LAST TIME OUT

EDINBURGH RUGBY 19-17 OSPREYS



Edinburgh Rugby clinched a dramatic two-point victory against Welsh side Ospreys in Round 6 of the BKT United Rugby Championship last weekend at Hive Stadium.

Tom Currie, Harri Morris and Harry Paterson all crossed the whitewash as Edinburgh claimed a somewhat nervy victory, their second of the season so far, which lifts them into 9th place.

The opening quarter saw Ospreys pressing hard. After securing consecutive penalties, they established a strong attacking position, driving from five metres out.

However, a crucial, try-saving moment came from Ben Muncaster, celebrating his 50th appearance, whose immense defensive effort managed to get under the ball and hold the opposition up.

Ospreys would break the deadlock ten minutes later. A sustained attacking phase culminated in outside centre Evardi Boshoff being tackled just short of the line; he managed to pop the ball to scrum-half Luke Davies, who crossed for the first try. The conversion attempt was unsuccessful. [0-5]

Edinburgh's response was swift, taking just seven minutes. Propelled by two successive penalties, Ross Thompson strategically used his boot to gain vital territory, bringing Edinburgh into the Ospreys' 22.

Following a few tight phases, flanker Tom Currie spotted a gap and darted through to score his first-ever try in Edinburgh colours. Thompson narrowly missed the conversion. [5-5]

Ospreys started the second half with intent, taking the lead just four minutes after the restart when inside centre Phil Cokanasiga powered over for their second try. The conversion was missed once more however, making it 5-10.

Just nine minutes later, Edinburgh responded strongly. From a 5-metre lineout drive, hooker Harri Morris peeled away from the maul to crash over for his second try for the club. Ross Thompson slotted the conversion this time, putting the home side ahead for the first time [12-10].

The crucial third try came at the 70-minute mark. After winning a scrum penalty, the ball was moved wide from the lineout on the 22, finding eventual Player of the Match, Findlay Thomson. The young centre put in a clever grubber which Harry Paterson raced onto, sliding under the sticks to bring Hive Stadium to its feet.



Replacement stand-off Cammy Scott added the easy conversion, extending the lead to nine points. [19-10]

Ospreys, however, refused to relent. Less than five minutes later, they notched their third try through Boshoff. Crucially, they failed to convert, allowing Edinburgh to maintain a two-point advantage with only five minutes left on the clock.

As Ospreys piled on the pressure, seeking the winning score, a massive defensive shift secured the result.

Back-row Liam McConnell got over the ball at the ruck to win a game-changing penalty which Edinburgh advanced into the Ospreys 22. In search of a fourth score to claim the bonus-point, Edinburgh pushed, however a cross-field kick eventually drifted over the whitewash, bringing the match to a close.
